



## Butler County Water & Sewer Department Water System Maintenance Notice

The Butler County Water and Sewer Department is repairing a water main in your area. Although this notice is not required, BCWS wants you to be informed.

### Why am I receiving this notice?

A water line repair means it is possible for bacteria to get into the water supply.

### Does this mean the water is unsafe?

Not necessarily. BCWS uses repair methods that minimize the risk of contamination. We are performing tests to determine if additional precautions are necessary. BCWS water has rarely had bacteria present after a water break.

### How long does it take to repair and test the main?

It usually takes 24–48 hours to fix the break and analyze the water samples. We will notify you with a new door tag if the advisory continues longer than 48 hours.

### How can I find out if testing is complete?

### Do I have to boil the water?

This notice is precautionary—boiling water is not required. However, you may choose to boil your water during this advisory to reduce your risk. This precaution may be necessary for the immuno-compromised, infants and elderly. Consult your health care provider for guidance.

### Do I need to boil all my water?

This precaution applies to water used for: drinking, cooking, making ice, brushing your teeth and preparing drinks such as juice, coffee and baby formula.

### What about bathing and laundry?

You do not need to boil water for bathing, laundry, or any other external use. You do not need to use boiled water to wash dishes if you let the dishes dry thoroughly before use.

### How long do I need to boil the water?

Boil the water vigorously for one minute. Bring the water to a full, rolling boil, and then start timing.

### Can't I just use my water filtration system?

Not all types of home filtration systems remove bacteria. You will need to check the manufacturer's certificate for your system to see if bacteria are removed.
